

Welcome back to Year 3! We are excited to see everyone and introduce our new Spring 2 topics. Here is some information on what we will be learning about this half term.

#### **Topic Overview & Key Text**

Our key text for this half term is 'Ali's Story' by Andy Glynne.

This informative book tells the story of a 10-yearold refugee who flees his home country of Afghanistan. The book documents his feelings and the thread of hope that can help him overcome the change.

# Maths

This term we will focus on fractions and building our knowledge around this topic. We will be revisiting fractions, including finding a half, quarter and third and counting in fractions. We will also be learning about mass and capacity. Regular time tables will also be a focus.

#### Writing

In this topic, the children will be exploring what it is like for a refugee and writing a letter from Ali telling his parents he is safe after leaving Afghanistan. The children will also study Ali as a character to empathise with his journey and experiences.

#### Reading

Within the reading unit, we will be continuing to embed skills such as: drawing inferences, making predictions and asking questions to improve our understanding of the text. We will also continue to complete weekly reading comprehension assessments in class.

#### **Home Reading**

It is so important for your child to be a regular reader at home. The children have been working so hard writing their own comments in their reading records and so we encourage them to carry this on. If your child is a fluent reader, then you do not need to listen to them read. However, you could question your child's understanding of the text. Please see our Parental Comment guide overleaf.

#### Homework

We will be using SeeSaw to set homework. Homework will be issued on Friday to be completed before Monday. Children are also expected to read every day at home.
