

Welcome to Nursery





Starting Nursery can be a tricky time for many children, but our staff are very experienced at helping children to settle quickly. Try not to worry.

The Nursery team plan exciting and engaging activities for the children which may be inside or outside. We learn outdoors in all weathers so please provide your child with a coat and wellington boots.



Topic Overview & Key Text

During the first few weeks we will be focusing on settling into our Nursery routines. Our team will be supporting the children to make new friends and discover which toys they like to play with.



After three weeks, we will be learning the story 'Peace at Last'. Poor Daddy Bear is trying to sleep but he can hear so many different noises. 'Snore, snore went Mrs Bear. Tick-tock, tick-tock went the clock.'

Reading

In Autumn 1, we will be learning the Nursery Rhymes, 'Twinkle, Twinkle', 'I'm a little teapot', 'Wheels on the Bus' and 'Dingle, dangle scarecrow'.



Learning to say rhymes helps us to understand rhyme which also helps us to speak.

In Nursery we encourage a love for reading so we will be sharing lots of stories. If your child has a favourite story at home, please let us know!

Writing

In Nursery we celebrate all mark making. We will be encouraging the children to explore and use a variety of tools, such as pencils, paint, water and sand, to make different marks.



Maths



In Autumn 1 we will be focusing on exploring and counting within 5. We will be learning different number rhymes and singing number songs. We will begin to discover that Maths is everywhere!

Homework

At home you can support your child's learning by talking to them about their day at school. What have they enjoyed? Which children did they play with?

Reading stories and singing nursery rhymes is also a wonderful way to help your child learn to communicate. Look out for your new sharing story book every Friday.
