

**Instrument of Government  
St John Chrysostom Federation**

1. The name of the federation is: **St John Chrysostom Federation**
2. The names and categories of the schools in the federation are:

Name	Category
St John's Church of England Primary School	Voluntary Controlled School
St Chrysostom's Church of England Primary School	Voluntary Controlled School

3. The name of the governing body is: "The governing body of St John Chrysostom Federation".
4. The governing body shall consist of the following:
  - One Executive Head Teacher
  - Two Parent governors
  - One Staff governor
  - One LA governor
  - Three foundation governors
  - Five co-opted governors
5. The total number of governors is **thirteen**.
6. The term of office for all governors (other than the executive head teacher and the ex-officio foundation governor) shall be four years.
7. Those entitled to appoint foundation governors are:
  - (a) The Diocesan Board of Education who appoint one governor
  - (b) The Parochial Church Council of the Parish, Ecclesiastical District or Team Ministry within which the federation is for the time being situated who appoint one governor
8. (a) The holder of the following office shall be a foundation governor ex-officio:
 

the Principal Officiating Minister

- (b) The Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry within which the school is situated shall be entitled to appoint a foundation governor to act in the place of the ex-officio Foundation governor whose governorship derives from the office named in (a) above, in the event that that ex-officio foundation governor is unable or unwilling to act as a foundation governor, or has been removed from office under Regulation 21 (1) of the Regulations, or there is a vacancy in the office from which this governorship derives.
9. The Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry within which the school is situated, following consultation with the Diocesan Board of Education, shall have the power to request the removal of the ex-officio foundation governor and to appoint any substitute.
10. The ethos statement of this federation of voluntary controlled schools is:

Recognising the historic foundation of the schools in the federation, the federation will preserve and develop the religious character of the schools in accordance with the principles of the Church of England and in partnership with the Church at parish and diocesan level.

The schools in the federation aim to serve their communities by providing an education of the highest quality within the context of Christian belief and practice. They encourage an understanding of the meaning and significance of faith, and promote Christian values through the experience they offer to all their pupils.

11. This instrument of government comes into effect on **1<sup>st</sup> September 2019**
12. This instrument was made by order of Manchester City Council Local Authority.
13. A copy of the instrument must be supplied to every member of the governing body (and the executive head teacher if not governor), any trustees and to the appropriate religious body.
