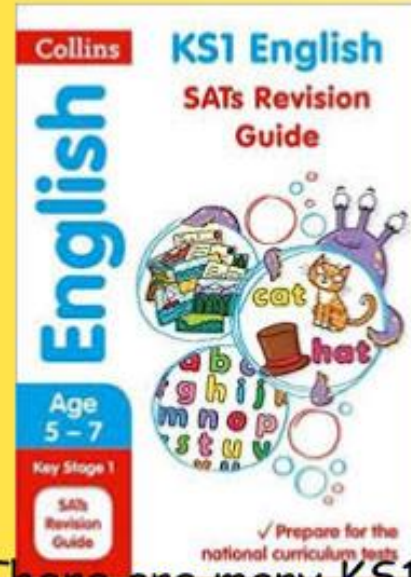
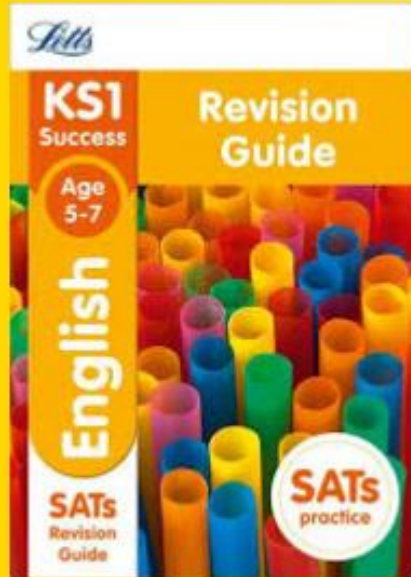
The Missing Pebble by Rachel

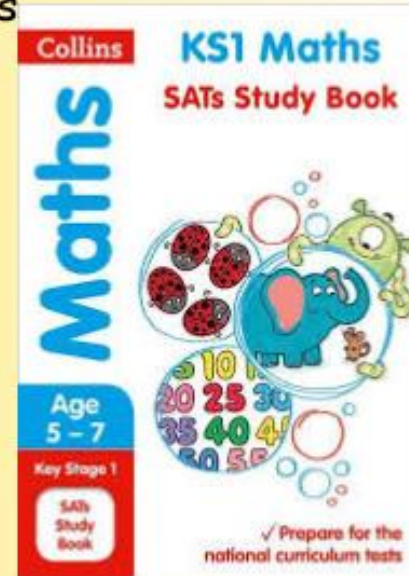
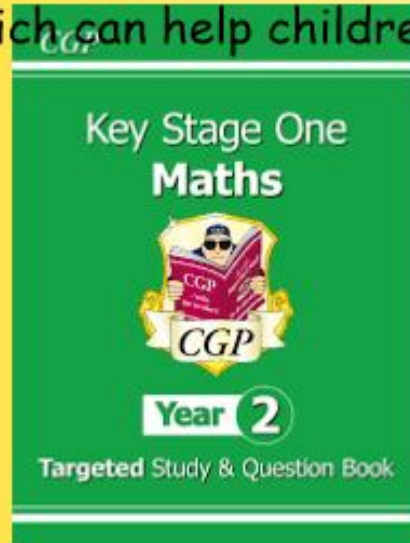
